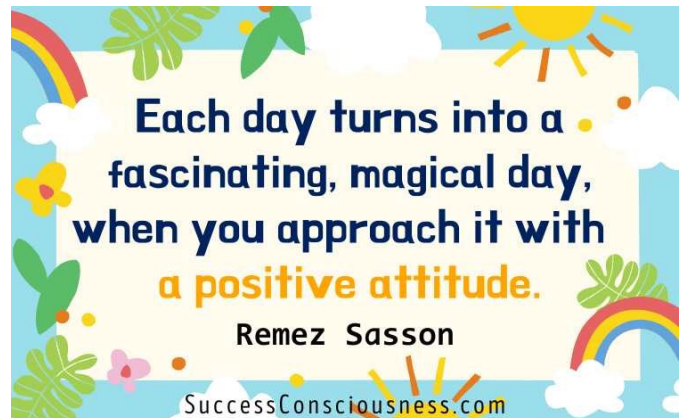

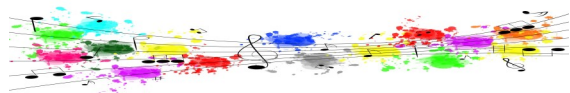
" World Music Tradition—Gamelan gong keybar"

Background to the music: Gamelan Gong Kebyar is a dynamic and vibrant form of Balinese gamelan music characterised by its fast tempo, intricate rhythms, and shimmering metallic sounds produced by various percussion instruments. "Kebyar" translates to "to flare up or burst open" in Balinese, reflecting the style's explosive nature. It's a type of gamelan that emerged around the early 1900s. Gamelan gong kebyar typically includes a variety of keyed metallophones, gongs, and drums. The ensemble also features double-headed drums called kendang.

The school football team has had a busy week competing in the Fisherman's Cup. Last Friday, we entertained Mayflower in the quarter final knowing we were in for a tough match.
