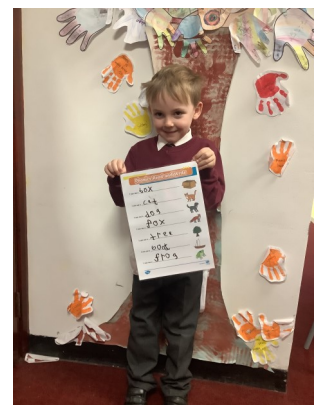
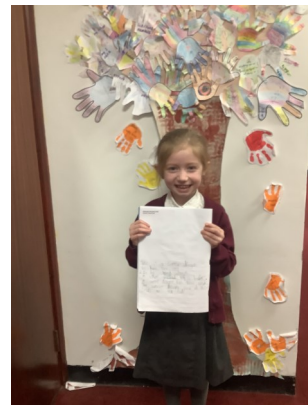

Dear Parent/Carers,

First, I must start by saying a massive “thank you” to all of our families who attended the HEP Inclusion & Diversity Festival last Friday. It was absolutely incredible to see so many of our pupils, and their families, joining in. The feedback, through our survey, has been overwhelmingly positive – and we really appreciate the comments around areas for improvement. From a HEP Headteacher point of view, the day absolutely surpassed our expectations, so thank you for pulling together as a community and participating in the day. Also, another thank you to all of you within the community who let us use your buildings with no hire charge; local agencies who embraced the ethos of the festival and set up activities and stalls; our “VIPs” including the Mayor; Ivan Henderson; Nigel Spencer; Andrew Moffat (from No Outsiders) and, of course, our staff – without them we would not have been able to exhibit the children’s learning around Inclusion and Diversity. They also ran the majority of activities on the day – so a big thank you to everyone involved!. It was wonderful to work alongside Kayleigh Reed, who is our local artist who, using the children’s designs, created the bench that now proudly sits behind Queen Victoria, facing out to sea. We are loving seeing all of the photographs of children sitting on the bench! Also, I must mention the HEP choirs. They did an amazing job, coming together on the day to sing three songs. I have to confess to standing at the back of Kingsway Hall, feeling very emotional, hearing such beautiful voices, sharing such important messages. This week, Sophia from Year 1 and Isaac from Reception class, came to share their learning with me. Sophia has been working really hard on her writing and Isaac was using his phonic knowledge to write words. I was really impressed with the progress both children are making and their enthusiasm in sharing their learning.



As promised, the number of school trips this year have greatly increased. Year 6 spent a session at Essex University on Wednesday. Yesterday, I received an email from the event organiser who stated:

“We hope the students enjoyed the day, their behaviour was exemplary and multiple organisations commented on this.” We always have high expectations of our pupils, but it is lovely when we receive such positive feedback about our pupils. Well done Year 6 – keep setting the example!
