Dear Parent/Carers,

Thank you for all of your positive comments regarding the Nite Owl experience last week. The children really did love it and the feedback about the photos has been really positive. As I have mentioned previously, we are looking to increase the experiences we can provide our pupils, both on site and off, so if you hear of anything please do let us know.

Our next experience is us transforming our playground into a farmyard. Later this month, Hasty's Farm from Clacton are bringing along a selection of their animals. All classes will have the opportunity to go outside and see our "mini farmyard on the playground".

On Monday, all staff and pupils gathered outside and took part in a Remembrance Day silence. As always, our pupils were incredibly respectful and made me incredibly proud. The day also included a Remembrance Day worship led by Tracey Tyrell, the Children and Families worker from the church. Year 3 and 4 also spent some time over at All Saints' church with Tracey in the afternoon. In addition to that, Charlotte Tricker (an All Saints' Parent Governor) delivered a workshop to each class around Remembrance Day. She discussed being ex-military and brought along uniforms and memorabilia. The children were fascinated by this and were allowed to dress up and handle the items Charlotte brought in. A really big "Thank You" to Charlotte for providing such an interesting insight to our pupils and making Remembrance Day even more poignant. We also raised £302 for the Poppy Appeal. Thank you for your donations.

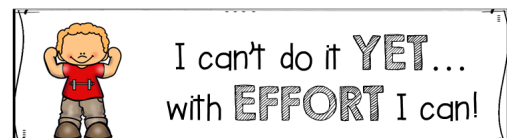
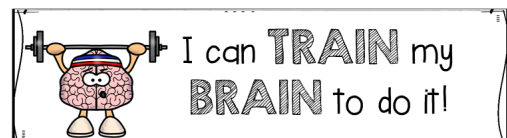
